This week's Worship and Reflection



"Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, 'What are you seeking?' They said, 'Rabbi, where are you staying?' 'Come,' he replied, 'and you will see.'" John 1:38-39a

The season of Epiphany that we're in, is all about seeing. Seeing Jesus for who He really is – our Saviour, redeemer and friend. Seeing signs of Jesus' presence in our lives and being thankful. And seeing how we can invite others to also 'come and see' what it means to know and love Jesus.

Our gospel reading from John, chapter 1, verses 35-42 opens with John the Baptist telling his own disciples about Jesus so that they turn and follow Him. And having believed, the first thing one of them (Andrew) does is tell his brother Simon so that he believes too. Jesus himself utters the invitation, to these first of his disciples, but also to you and me, to 'come and see' who He is and what He is doing.

A new year is often a time of reflection, on the year just gone and also what lies ahead. The ideal time then to ponder, and answer for ourselves, the questions posed by this season of Epiphany:

What are YOU seeking? Do we see Jesus as our Saviour, redeemer and friend? Do we see signs of His presence in our lives and know what He has done for us? And do we tell others that we have met Jesus and invite them to also 'come and see'?

There is choice in these questions and also a challenge. When we have found the Jesus we seek, or we have been found by Him, then it is our turn to use the gifts He has given us to tell the story of God's hope-filled and redeeming grace that has touched our lives. In telling our story, we invite others, in turn, to 'come and see' this Jesus and be loved.

In this new year, we will sing God's song together, that same never-ending song of hope and grace and peace, so that everyone might hear it.
