This Week's Worship and Reflection



"Do you believe this?" John 11:26b

This week we celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (WPCU). We know that the Church throughout the CHRISTIAN world is divided over many issues of theology and practice; what we believe and how we behave. This interna-

tional ecumenical prayer event is an opportunity to say sorry for the mess we humans can make of God's Church, to pray for Christians United (!) and to ask God to show us how we can 'love our neighbour,' especially when they don't worship or think or speak like we do.

This year's worship for the WPCU has been prepared by the community of Bose, an ecumenical monastery of sisters and brothers in Northern Italy. We are invited to reflect on the story of Martha's confession of faith in Jesus told in John's gospel, ch11, verses 17-27. This passage comes before the raising of Lazarus, and Martha is upset with Jesus for arriving too late to save her brother, who is already dead.

In this crunchy conversation with Martha, Jesus asks her if she believes that through Him, everyone who believes will live? Martha responds in vs 27, "I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who is come into the world.' She was one of a small few to profess such faith at this time.

I wonder where you are in your journey of faith. Are you a season ticket holder for Christians United (!)? Are you taking your first steps on the road to faith? Or somewhere in between? Sometimes, becoming a Christian can feel like having to believe a number of seemingly impossible things before breakfast, a task made even trickier when not all Christians approach matters of belief in the same way.

In this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, there is diversity in the Christian Church, but we are united in our belief in Jesus. So, as we step out in faith at the start of 2025, let us remember Martha's simple confession of her faith – she believed in Jesus. That was enough.
