This week's Worship and Reflection



**Candlemas – Jesus is presented in the temple
“... a light for revelation to the Gentiles and the
glory of your people Israel.” Luke 2:32**

On Sunday we are celebrating the feast of Candlemas which ends the church's Christmas and Epiphany season. Candlemas, like the rest of Epiphany, is full of stories of light – pointing us towards Jesus - unlike the dark January days which are thankfully now at an end! Candles

too are about light, and Candlemas is traditionally a time when all the church candles for the year are blessed and people light candles in their windows. Like many others, I will be finally taking down my Christmas tree and lights, as the year turns towards Lent and Easter, a few short weeks away.

In the gospel reading for Candlemas (Luke 2:22-40) we read about Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the temple when he is 40 days old, as was the Jewish custom, to present him to God and offer a sacrifice of two doves or pigeons. There, the holy family meet Simeon and then Anna, two devout people who had waited faithfully in the temple to meet the Messiah, the Saviour many Jews had been waiting a long time for.

Holding a new baby is often an emotional experience – a new life and the hope they represent. But Simeon and Anna's response to meeting Jesus was profound. Anna gave thanks to God and spoke about Jesus to everyone there. Simeon immediately knew he was holding the Messiah: he called Jesus 'a light', not only for the Jewish people but also for the Gentiles, non-Jews. A radical claim indeed for the temple crowd, and a puzzling one for his parents.

For us, Candlemas is yet another reminder that Jesus came to be the light of the whole world – a light no darkness can overcome – a message the world needs right now. And that when we choose to follow Jesus and live His Way, we receive His light and are called to BE lights, showing others the way to meet Jesus for themselves.

This week, let's shine as lights in the world, to the glory of God the Father.
