# This Week's Worship and Reflection

# Why Jesus Praised a Dodgy Manager (and What That Means for Us!)

This Sunday we hear one of Jesus' most puzzling parables: the story of the shrewd manager (Luke 16:1–13).

Why does Jesus seem to praise someone dishonest? At first glance it sounds as though Jesus is congratulating someone for cheating! But look closer and we discover something deeper. The manager is praised not for dishonesty but for his urgency, his ability to act decisively when time was short.

What can this teach us about living faithfully today?

Alongside Paul's call in 1 Timothy 2 to pray "for everyone," we'll explore how God entrusts us with time, money, relationships and prayer—not to hoard, but to invest in what lasts.

Think of essential and urgent things you have to do in your life, like when a Doctor calls you in for a health check-up, or finding a grandchild lost in a large shopping-centre: time is short you don't waist time, quick choices matter. Jesus tells us to live with the same urgency—because what we do with our money, time and relationships really matters.

Come and explore with us as we reflect on how living generously, living wisely and living prayerfully will shape a life well lived in God's world.

#### Luke 16:1-23

Jesus told his disciples: 'There was a rich man whose manager was accused of wasting his possessions. So he called him in and asked him, "What is this I hear about you? Give an account of your management, because you cannot be manager any longer."

'The manager said to himself, "What shall I do now? My master is taking away my job. I'm not strong enough to dig, and I'm ashamed to beg-I know what I'll do so that, when I lose my job here, people will welcome me into their houses."

'So he called in each one of his master's debtors. he asked the first, "How much do you owe my master?"

"Three thousand litres of olive oil, "he replied.

'The manager told him, "Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifteen hundred."

'Then he asked the second, "And how much do you owe?"

"Thirty tons of wheat," he replied.

'He told him, "Take your bill and make it twenty-four."

'The master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly. For the people of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own kind than are the people of the light. I tell you, use worldly wealth to gain friends for yourselves, so that when it is gone, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings.

'Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much and whoever is dishonest with very little will be dishonest with much. So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches? And if you have not been trustworthy with someone else's property, who will give you property of your own? 'No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other or you will be devoted to the one despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.

#### To Pray

Merciful God, your Son came to save us and bore our sins on the cross: may we trust in your mercy and know your love, rejoicing in the righteousness that is ours through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen Collect for the fourteenth Sunday after Trinity
